Why Being Prepared Matters in the Caribbean

But before getting into the details, please know that the two most important ways to handle potential situations is to buy solid travel insurance (I'll write more about that soon) and to ALWAYS use a travel agent.

Flight Cancellations & Delays—Your Action Plan

1. Stay Calm & Get the Facts
 - a. Open your airline's app or website for real-time updates.
 - b. Listen for airport announcements and request written confirmation of the delay/cancellation.
2. Call your Travel Agent
3. Contact the Airline Directly
 - a. Use the hotline or WhatsApp for quicker service (often faster than standing in line).
 - b. Ask about rebooking, compensation, and meal/hotel vouchers if overnight.
4. Know Your Rights
 - a. For flights departing from/within the U.S., EU, or UK, you may be entitled to compensation or rebooking.
 - b. Request all details in writing.
5. Arrange Accommodation
 - a. If stranded, ask the airline for hotel assistance, or use reputable booking apps.
 - b. Local tourism offices can recommend safe, nearby stays.
6. Notify Your Host & Transfers

- a. Contact your hotel, guesthouse, or driver to update your arrival time.
7. Document Everything
 - a. Save receipts, take photos of info boards for insurance claims.

Medical Emergencies—How to Get Help Fast

1. Assess the Situation
 - a. For serious injuries or life-threatening conditions, call local emergency services immediately (see Quick Reference below).
2. Find the Nearest Medical Facility
 - a. Ask hotel staff or locals for the closest hospital or clinic. Many larger resorts will have medical staff on site for less urgent needs.
 - b. Private clinics may offer faster service; ask about payment options.
3. Call your Travel Agent
4. Use Your Travel Insurance
 - a. Call your provider ASAP for instructions and coverage details.
5. Contact Your Embassy or Consulate
 - a. If you need help with language, logistics, or evacuation, reach out to your country's embassy.
6. Stay Connected
 - a. Update family or friends about your situation.

Weather Events—Navigating Hurricanes & Storms

1. Monitor Official Advisories
 - a. Follow the National Hurricane Center, local government websites, and hotel bulletins.
2. Follow All Instructions
 - a. Obey evacuation or shelter-in-place orders from local authorities and hotel staff.
3. Prepare an Emergency Kit
 - a. Keep water, snacks, medications, phone charger, ID, and cash on hand.
4. Call your Travel Agent
5. Keep receipts of all unexpected expenses caused by the situation for insurance purposes
6. Stay Informed
 - a. Use local radio, hotel bulletins, and official social media for updates.
7. After the Storm
 - a. Wait for the all-clear before going out; check with airlines and hotels for changes.
